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#### TRANSCRIBING DOLLAR AMOUNTS

(For information only – NOT part of transcription homework)

1. When there are no cents, you DO NOT type the decimal and the 00 (.00).

For example: \$450 (NOT \$450.00)

2. When the amount is a million or above, transcribe as follows:

45 million (NOT 45,000,000)

- \$45 billion (NOT \$45 billion dollars) \*\*The "dollar" sign (\$) already shows that "dollars" was spoken so spelling out "dollars" would be like saying, "45 billion dollars dollars."
  45,000 (NOT 45 thousand) \*\*Remember, only "million" and above are spelled out.
  4500 (NOT 45 hundred) \*\*This number is spoken as, "forty-five hundred" and is transcribed with no comma. There is no dollar sign so "dollars" is not spoken."
  4,500 \*\*This number is spoken as, "four thousand five hundred" and is transcribed with a comma. Again, "dollars" is not spoken because there is no dollar sign.
  \$4,500 \*\*This number is spoken as, "four thousand five hundred dollars" because there is a "dollar" sign.
- 3. Compound numbers are hyphenated when written out.

For example:	twenty-six
	fifty-eight
	ninety-nine



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#### TRANSCRIBING DOLLAR AMOUNTS CONTINUED:

\*\*NOTE: When "a" is spoken in place of "one," you MUST transcribe this number using words as in the above example. Also note that the word "dollar" is also written to show the software that you want the word "dollar" to be spelled out as opposed to the \$ sign.
